As part of the Olympic Legacy, schools in England have been allocated a significant amount of money to help raise the profile of PE in schools. The money can be spent in any way that enhances the teaching of PE and leads to a healthy and active lifestyle. Schools were given £8000 and an additional £5 per child. This means Callowell was entitled to around £8800. We had a carry forward of £5,200 from previous years. One of the conditions of this money is that we must publish on our website how we have spent the money so far and what plans we have to spend the rest.

Priorities for the spending

- To increase participation at clubs through offering more / different clubs
- To use expert coaching and staff CPD in KS1 to raise standards and participation
- To establish club pathways for G&T children
- To bring in rigorous pupil assessment and tracking for P.E.
- To promote a healthy lifestyle
- To keep the profile of P.E. high in the school
